Half Term 1- Community – The Church as the Body of Christ	 To understand the key beliefs and teachings of the Catholic Church. To understand the structure of the Bible and the importance of key stories and events – Genesis account of creation, Abraham and Sarah, Moses, reign of King David and life of Jesus and the Apostles. To explain the purpose and importance of the seven sacraments – baptism, Eucharist, confirmation, reconciliation, anointing of the sick, and holy orders. To describe and evaluate the nature of the Catholic community as outlined in the Bible as one Body in Christ. 	 Keyword test. 12 question quiz and exam style question - Old Testament. Multiple choice topic review – online. Formal Assessment – Does everyone in the Catholic Church make up the Body of Christ?
Half Term 2 – Life in Christ – The nature of the Trinity and life of Jesus	 To understand the nature of the Trinity and explore the life of Jesus in the Gospels. To understand the Catholic teaching of three persons in one God and where it is outlined in the Bible. To outline the characteristics and role of each person in the Trinity – God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. To understand the Incarnation and evaluate the belief that Jesus is both human and divine. To reflect on the role and importance of Our Lady as a model of faith for Catholics. 	 Keyword test. Trinity review – exam questions. Incarnation and Our Lady review. Formal Assessment – Is Jesus both human and divine?
Half Term 3 – Creation and Stewardship	 To understand different Christian interpretations of the Genesis account of creation. To understand the events in Genesis 1, Genesis 2 and Genesis 3. To analyse the nature of God as represented in the Genesis accounts. To explain the different Christian interpretations of the Genesis account. To reflect on the Christian belief that humans are made in God's image and are therefore responsible for being stewards of creation. 	 Keyword test. Creation creative response. Topic review – online. Formal Assessment – The world was made in seven days – provide different Christian understandings.
Half Term 4 – Holy Week – Key events leading to the death of Jesus	 To understand the Biblical events of Holy Week and their importance for Catholics. To prepare for the coming of Lent – to reflect on the account of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness and to understand how Lent is observed by members of the Church. To explain key features of the Biblical account of Palm Sunday, the Last Supper, the Crucifixion of Jesus (Good Friday) and the Resurrection (Easter Sunday). To analyse how the events have impacted Christian belief and forms of worship. 	 Keyword test. Holy Week creative response. Topic review – exam questions. Formal Assessment – Good Friday is the most important event during Easter.
Half Term 5 – Forms of Expression – How Catholics express their faith.	 To understand how Christians express their faith through prayer, worship, artwork, drama, music and architecture. To understand different forms of prayer and explain why they are important for individual Catholics and as a community. To explain the different features of a Catholic Mass and their importance. To reflect on how Catholics use artworks to worship and analyse the Christian beliefs reflected in Michelangelo's Creation of Adam fresco and the Icon of Christ. To explain the different internal features inside a Catholic Church and how they are used to support worship. 	 Keyword test. Topic review – exam questions. Artwork review. Formal Assessment – Artwork is the best way to help Catholics understand God.
Half Term 6 – Islam – Key beliefs and practices	 To understand the key beliefs and practices in Islam. To understand the life of the Prophet Muhammad. To explain the features and importance of the Qur'an, Muslim worship and the Mosque. To explore the five pillars of Islam and how they impact the lives of Muslims. To evaluate the importance of the pilgrimage Hajj. 	 Keyword test. Research project Ramadan. Topic review – exam questions. Formal Assessment - Miracles prove that God exists.
