Why do we have a school fund?

Our school fund is used to advance the education provided at St. Bede's Catholic High School. By having a school fund, we can provide additional resources, site improvements, materials and equipment. Our school fund also finances extra-curricular activities which cannot be completely financed by public funds allocated to the school. The school fund directly benefits the children who are educated at St. Bede's.

Why is it called the St. Matthew Fund?

At St. Bede's we are a passionately Catholic community, and our faith is central to all that we do. We consulted pupil representatives about various names to give our school fund and our pupils chose to name it 'the St. Matthew Fund'. Amongst other things, St. Matthew is the patron saint of finances, so this is an appropriate choice. We are pleased to know that our fundraising efforts are under the patronage of a gospel writer and one of the twelve apostles.

How is money raised for the St. Matthew Fund?

As with most school funds, we rely on the generosity of the members of our community to support us. We receive voluntary contributions from parents/carers and wider community members who are keen to support the school. At times we will raise school funds through fundraising initiatives and charitable activities. All voluntary donations are gratefully received.



What can the St. Matthew Fund pay for?

We are always looking for ways to improve the pupil experience at St. Bede's and the St. Matthew Fund will support us with this. We can use the fund to pay for educational visits, IT equipment such as iPads, sports facilities, library improvements and much more.





Our focus areas are guided by the needs of the pupils, and we strongly consider their views when we determine priorities. Below are some of our current areas of focus.

- Improvement to sporting facilities through the provision of an AstroTurf.
- We wish to improve our changing room facilities to provide a more spacious area.
- We would like to create material improvements to the music rooms and equipment which would enable us to expand our curriculum offer.
- We also wish to improve our library and provide pupils with an even wider range of books.
- Access to the latest IT equipment can be vital for the enrichment of pupil education, and we wish to provide tablets and screens which will benefit our pupils, particularly those with SEND.

The children, staff and governors at our school are continually looking at ways to develop and improve the school. For this reason, we have a rolling programme of projects to continue the development of our school and enhance learning.
