# General Notices

**Arrangements for the barbeque – Thursday, 12<sup>th</sup> May:** Any pupils who have not pre-ordered a barbeque meal will either be able to buy the usual snacks at break or should bring a packed lunch to school. The dining room will be closed at lunchtime on this day and no food will be served. Pupils will not be able to change their minds on their choice of barbeque food after indicating their choice on SchoolPost.

Lunchtime will begin at 12.15 for Year 11 pupils only and at 12.25pm for other year groups. Pupils will line-up along the front of the Sports Hall in the following order: Year 11, Year 10, Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9. You will be called forward by a member of staff. The playground area in front of the Qube (including the shelter) will be divided off throughout lunchtime.

You will circulate through a one-way system past the barbeque to collect your cooked food before collecting salad and pasta items from the tables. There will be no access to the building via the door next to the chapel during the barbeque lunchtime.

Although no other food will be available to purchase over the lunch break, extra drinks, biscuits, slush and ice lollies will be on sale from the Qube in addition to the barbeque. Please remember to help our hardworking site supervisors and ensure that all litter goes in the bins. A bell will ring at 1.15 pm to indicate the end of lunchtime.

**Music arrangements:** Period 3 – band members and singers to meet Mr Warrington in the Music Room.

**In the event of wet weather:** The school hall will be open with the bands/singers performing from the stage. If you wish to enter the hall before your lunch (or if you are not having a barbeque lunch, please use the internal door opposite the stairway to the Art Department. Once you have collected your barbeque meal from the dining room, access the hall from the dining room. The doors from the hall to the outside area will be EXIT ONLY.

Pupils will go into the dining room to collect their barbeque meal in the following order: Year 11, Year 10, Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9. You will be called forward by a member of staff.

Year 11 – to line up along the boys' toilet corridor. Years 10, 9 and 8 to line up along the main corridor past the English classrooms. Year 7 to wait in the Science corridors until they are called forward.

In the dining room, you will follow a one-way system from the reception end of the counter to the hall end to collect the barbeque. If there are seats available in the dining room, you may stay there or enter the hall where there will be additional tables and seating available.

**Cycling to and from school:** If you cycle to school or cycle in your own time, you are reminded of the need to dismount and push your bike across pedestrian crossings or crossings supervised by a School Crossing Patrol officer. You also need to comply with instructions given by a School Crossing Patrol officer. You have a responsibility to keep pedestrians safe - pavements and crossings are for their use. The privilege of cycling to school will be removed for anyone whose behaviour presents concern with regard to this.

**Water:** Keeping well hydrated is important. Please replenish your bottles during break or lunchtime. You should not be going to the water fountain during lesson times.
