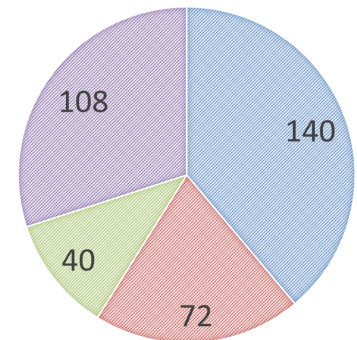

In a survey, people were asked about their favourite fruit pie. The pie chart shows the outcome. The angles shown are exact with no rounding. What is the smallest number of people who could have been surveyed?

There were 281 entrants to the most recent Numeracy Challenge. To solve the problem you just needed to count the number of squares that were on the surface of the shape. There were five on the top, five on the bottom, and twelve around the sides. This meant that the surface area was 22 square centimetres. Well done to Sophie Bailey from 9 Finch who correctly found this out.
