

Rise Against Hunger - over 50,000 meals packed!

On Saturday, 14th May, a number of our pupils and staff joined with Lytham Rotary Club in an ambitious project to pack a target of 50,000 meals for schools in Ouagadougou in Burkina Faso for Rise Against Hunger, a charity founded in 2015 to respond to the United Nation's goals to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure prosperity for all by 2030. By the end of the day, the target was smashed with a total of 50,112 meals packed and ready to be delivered.

Members of the Rotary Club were deeply impressed by the positive approach of our pupils and their commitment to 'making a difference' as global citizens. Thank you to all who took part.

Arrangements for Year 11 pupils after half-term – information for pupils:

Pupils with an exam only in the morning:

You should report to their form tutor who will register you and escort you and others to the Sports Hall. When you have completed your exam, you are free to go home. Year 11 teaching staff will be available in their timetabled classrooms to support any pupils who want to revise or require guidance.

Pupils with an exam only in the afternoon:

You should come into school in good time for the start of your exam. Registration will be via the exam seating record.

Pupils with morning and afternoon exams:

When you need to remain in school between morning and afternoon exams, you are to report to the classrooms you would be normally timetabled for. Your timetabled class teachers will be available to supervise you during revision. You must stay on the school premises throughout the day. If your teachers have asked you to attend revision sessions during the school day when you don't have exams, you will need to sign in and out at the school reception.
