
part in some way. Members of the SVP will be collecting donations during form time and breaks.

Numeracy Challenge 36



There are 100 sheep in a field. It takes them 28 days to eat all of the grass. How long would it take 35 sheep to eat the same amount of grass?

Numeracy Challenge 34 was successfully answered by Isaac Whall from 7 Harcourt. To find the answer you needed to solve the inequality by applying mathematical inverses. Dividing all parts by 2 and then subtracting 3 gives the inequality $-5 < x \le 1$, so the integers are -4, -3, -2, -1, 0 and 1. The sum of them would therefore be -9.
