#### **Attendance Update**

As you know, returning to pre-pandemic expectations regarding attendance is an important priority for the school this year. This means aiming for 100% attendance and 100% punctuality each week and each term. We have made a really encouraging start in this respect, with attendance above national figures and ahead of the same period last year. Year 7 are leading the way, with 98% attendance overall. Across the year groups, there are 465 pupils (56% of the school population) who have still have 100% attendance since the beginning of term. Thank you for your support in achieving these high standards.

Of course, young people just like adults do become unwell from time to time and there are occasions where the right place for them to be is at home. Please do remember, however, that each day of absence means five hours of missed teaching, which is not easily caught up on. Please ensure that your child is too ill to attend school each day before you take the decision to keep them at home, and that they are absent from school for no longer than is absolutely necessary.

Please may I also remind you that requests for absence in term-time can only be granted in exceptional circumstances. Requests for absence due to holidays are unlikely to be granted, and parental work patterns and the variation in the cost of holidays during term time are not considered exceptional circumstances.

Please see below our whole-school attendance level for the current week and the academic year overall, which you can compare to the attendance level of your child in Class Charts.

#### **Governing Body Vacancies**

There are currently vacancies on the Governing Body for both Foundation and Parent Governors. The role of the Governing Body is to operate at a strategic level, for example by holding the Headteacher and leadership to account and overseeing the budget and financial performance of the school.

Foundation Governors are appointed by the Bishop specifically to preserve and develop the Catholic ethos of the school. The Diocese has published 'Called to Serve,' a guide to being a Foundation Governor in a Catholic school. An electronic version of this document is attached to this update. Parent Governors are elected by current Saint Bede's parents and carers, and a separate letter will be issued shortly regarding the election process.
