Holocaust Memorial Day

27th January is Holocaust Memorial Day, marking 78 years since the liberation of the Auschwitz-Birkenau Death Camp in 1945. Today we remember the millions of people murdered by the Nazis in the Holocaust during the Second World War, including approximately six million Jews, as well as the victims of more recent genocides. Pupils have been reflecting on this theme throughout the week during our daily prayers, and I am grateful to Mr Coleman who delivered a series of extremely moving and though-provoking assemblies.

We are pleased to offer a 'Breakfast Club' provision in school from 8.00am, providing pupils with an opportunity to socialise, play games or catch up on work. Similarly, we run an after-school provision in our SLC until 5.30pm.

Please be mindful that 'Breakfast Club' is not staffed or supervised until 8.00am when school opens to pupils. We respectfully ask parents/carers not to drop children off at school before this time.

E-Cigarettes & Vaping

I have written to you on a number of occasions to express my concern about 'vaping' among some of our pupils, and to highlight the sanctions in place if pupils breach our rules relating to this. This is for the safety and well-being of all our pupils, and I know that the vast majority of parents/carers support and understand this approach.

Recently, concerns have arisen nationally regarding children and young people experimenting with 'THC vaping.' THC is the chemical which produces the 'high' effect in Cannabis and is illegal in the UK. I am circulating with this newsletter an information leaflet about this trend, produced by a local authority in London. Please read this leaflet carefully and discuss the contents with your child if you know or suspect they may be vaping.
