Thank you for your understanding regarding the NEU strike action on Wednesday. As I explained in my earlier letter, the NEU have indicated they will be taking further strike action in the north-west region on the following dates:

- Thursday 16th March 2023

Having reviewed the impact of the strike action on Saint Bede's this week, and the likely impact of the next strike on 28th February, I can confirm that **school will be closed to Year 10 pupils on Tuesday 28th February.** Pupils in Years 7, 8, 9 and 11 will attend school as normal.
