### General Notices

CAFOD Own Clothes Day: As part of our Lenten fundraising for CAFOD, we will hold a non-uniform day on the last day of term, Friday 31st March. We ask that pupils contribute a minimum donation of £2, with all proceeds going to the CAFOD Lenten appeal. If you can give more this would be greatly appreciated. Contributions will be collected via ParentPay.

Pupils and parents/carers should be aware that although this will be a non-uniform day, the below expectations will apply:

- Pupils should be dressed professionally and appropriately for children in a school environment.
- Inappropriate dress would include clothing where the midriff is displayed.
- Skirts must be an appropriate length, as with school uniform.
- The usual standards regarding hair, jewellery and make-up will continue to apply. This includes false tans, false eyelashes, nail varnish and false /acrylic nails which are all not permitted.

Should any pupil arrive to school dressed inappropriately, parents/carers may be contacted for arrangements to be made for the pupil to go home and get changed. Alternatively, the pupil may be asked to work in the Inclusion Room for the day. Our usual rules regarding mobile phones will, of course, continue to apply throughout the day

End of term arrangements: In light of school closing at 1.00 pm, the timings of the day have been revised. In preparation for Holy Week, all year groups will attend the 'Voices of the Passion' liturgy in the hall. Food will be served as normal during lunchtime. Pupils will follow their normal timetable during the morning and should bring the necessary books and equipment for those lessons. During the liturgies, bags and coats to be left in classrooms.
