Trinity

The word 'Trinity' is very important in Christianity as it explains a key teaching about the way that Christians understand the nature of God. For Christians, God is trinity, that is, a tri unity or three united together. We call these persons, 'Father', 'Son' and 'Holy Spirit'.

A helpful way of explaining the Holy Trinity comes from the teaching of St Patrick. He used a shamrock to help. Although it is one plant, it has three separate leaflets -correct terminology for the leaves) but one» stem. So the Trinity is three separate parts to the same centre.

What does this mean for Christians?

The same is true of the Christian idea of the Trinity. The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are separate but they are facets, faces, of the same God.

God the Father, the one who cares for us and loves us like a good father. He is the creator and sustainer of the world.

God the Son, Jesus, the one who was sent to earth as a human being in order to save humanity from itself. He is both fully God and fully human. He is the example of how to be.

God the Holy Spirit, the aspect of God present and working in the world. Like the wind, the Holy Spirit cannot be seen but the Spirit's power can be felt.

And so the three separate parts come together to create God. They are separate and yet work together and within one another.

General Notices
