We need to talk about becoming a saint with a lowercase s — one of the millions of unnamed and unknown persons who have found God in their lives and loved or love God with all their minds, souls and hearts.

You may know some of them. Think of people you know who care tirelessly for others and go the extra mile to help people and make their lives better. No saint (famous or unknown) is perfect and this should give us hope.

But none of us can *make* ourselves saints. None of us can even say the name of Jesus in faith without His grace. It is God who reaches out to us, not we who first choose God. It all starts with God and it ends with God, and in between there are nothing but God-laden moments, although we may not always recognise them as such.
