## Thank You

It has been lovely to welcome our pupils back to school for what has been a successful first week. Thank you for your support in achieving this.

Our new 'BEDE' ethos (Behaviour, Engagement, Devotion and Excellence) has been at the heart of all aspects of the school day. Year 7 pupils have adapted very quickly to the differing routines of secondary school life. Year 11 have, as I knew they would, acted as exemplary ambassadors for the school and role models for our younger pupils. Our 'line-up' routine has allowed for a settled start to the day, ensured punctuality to lesson and kept our busy corridors as calm, orderly and safe as possible. We are becoming a more prayerful community by beginning every single lesson in prayer. Standards of uniform and appearance have been exceptionally high, and I am particularly grateful to pupils for meeting our new expectations regarding jewellery without fuss. Pupils have adapted to the slightly earlier start to the school day well – with the various roadworks in our local area not causing quite as much disruption as we feared!

## **Attendance update**

#### Whole-school attendance this week: 97%

We know that maintaining a high level of attendance at school is vital for the health, wellbeing and life chances of children and young people. Thank you for your support with our focus on attendance last year, which ensured that the average attendance in each of the current Years 8-11 was significantly above the national average. In our introductory assemblies this week, I shared with pupils that in last year's Saint Bede's Year 11, pupils with an attendance level of above 95% achieved an average of <u>2 to 3 grades higher in every GCSE subject</u> compared to those who had an attendance level of below 90%.

We recognise that it can sometimes be difficult for parents/carers to judge whether their child is well enough to attend school, particularly following the COVID-19 pandemic. The NHS advises that it is usually appropriate for children to attend school with a mild respiratory illness – the 'bugs' that are particularly common in the winter months. This would include general cold symptoms such as a minor cough, runny nose, or sore throat.

The NHS has produced a document to help parents/carers decide whether their child should continue to attend school if they are being affected by a range of symptoms and illnesses. The guidance is available via the link below. We hope you find this helpful.

## School Production 2024 – The Lion King

Hakuna Matata! Following the enormous success of last year's production of 'Narnia,' we are delighted to announce that this year's musical will be 'The Lion King.' All pupils from Years 7-11 are invited to be involved.

There will be an introductory workshop on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> September in the hall from 3.30-4.30pm. This workshop is for anyone who thinks they may be interested in performing, designing, or helping backstage. Pupils will learn the audition song, which will be taught by our producer Anthony Roberts, and audition pieces will be handed out and discussed. Formal auditions will be held in the hall on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> September from 3.30pm onwards. Please do encourage your child to go along to the workshop and find out more.

## Summer e-mail issues - update

During the summer holiday, a member of staff reported that they had been the victim of a 'phishing' attack on their school email account. The attacker had used the account to send out phishing emails to the member of staff's contacts. The member of staff also reported other suspicious activity on their account that meant they were unable to receive emails. As the member of staff acted quickly to report the issue, we were able to block the account whilst we investigated the issue further.

As required in these circumstances, the incident has been reported to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO). In addition to the member of staff's own contacts, other email contacts of the school, including parents, pupils and staff, were swiftly notified of the issue, and given advice on how to deal with any suspicious emails they received. The school liaised with Microsoft and Lancashire Education Digital Services to contain and monitor the incident.

As a precautionary measure, and based on the advice we received from Microsoft, pupil accounts were suspended for the rest of the summer holidays to aid this process. To date, no reports of any adverse impact from the phishing attack have been identified or received.

## 'Grassroots' bullying and conflict reduction programme

This year Saint Bede's is taking part in a workshop-based programme called 'Grassroots', which is designed to reduce incidents of conflict and bullying between young people. This scheme has previously been successfully piloted in the USA, and participating schools saw a 60% reduction of conflict between children. The trial is now moving to the UK, and we are delighted that Saint Bede's has been given the opportunity to participate.
