While we may not face the same challenge Jesus faced, with crowds demanding our attention, we all have demands in our lives which may hinder us from doing what we would like to do. Here Jesus sets us a good example of simply giving ourselves some time alone to pray.

Year 10 Careers event

On Wednesday, our Year 10 pupils took part in a careers-focused afternoon. They were introduced to LMI (Labour Market Information), and how this can help inform their choices when choosing a career. They also analysed the 'Pillars of Growth' in Lancashire, before moving on to focusing on Advanced Manufacturing and Aerospace, receiving job specification, CV and interview training. Later, they worked in groups to explore supply chain, having to pitch to obtain a jet production contract for the Ministry of Defence. They even had to make their own foam jets, manage finances and avoid international espionage!

House Badges

A distinctive feature of our school and 'Being a Bede' is the wearing of badges which, reflect a range of achievements or responsibilities pupils have been awarded. In addition, all pupils (as well as staff) have now been issued with a 'House' badge – a coloured badge reflecting the patron of the form and house they belong to as below.
