Year 11 Exam Preparation Evening

On Wednesday 1st November at 6.30pm we will be inviting Year 11 parents/carers and pupils into school for our Exam Preparation Evening. Shoes – September 2024

I would like to remind you of the below change to our expectations regarding shoes, which I wrote to you about in July 2023 and will be implemented from September 2024.

In recent years, we have taken a liberal approach to our expectation regarding shoes, and permitted some shoes which are sold as school shoes but are in fact trainers. In particular, this includes the 'Air Force 1' shoe by Nike. For September 2023, these shoes will continue to be acceptable so long as any embellishments (such as a metal clip) are removed.

However, I would like to inform you that from <u>September 2024</u> we will be properly enforcing our policy regarding shoes and these 'trainer-type' shoes will not be permitted. We hope that these new expectations will be helpful to parents and carers, by removing the pressure to purchase very expensive designer trainers. By providing 12 months' notice we are allowing plenty of time for shoes which will no longer be allowed in school to be suitably replaced.
