Important online safeguarding message for all parents/carers

Some of our pupils have brought to our attention that there is a person using the name 'Bella Davies,' with accounts set up on Instagram, Snapchat and Tik Tok. This person is posing as a child who has recently moved to the area, under the false pretence that they are going to be joining our school in Year 9. This is untrue.

In some cases, mobile phone numbers have been exchanged and conversations have taken place via iMessage. During their interactions with our pupils, this person has been gathering personal information such as where pupils live, how they travel to school, and plans they have for outside of school over the weekend and in the coming weeks. They have also obtained the names of other pupils in our school who are visible in our pupils' personal social media platforms.

We have taken the necessary steps to safeguard those we know have been in direct contact with this person. We have also spoken to all of Year 9 directly and notified the police of our concerns.

It is important that all parents/carers are aware of this concern and we ask that you continue to be proactive in monitoring your child's online activity to keep them safe.
